Cygnets Class



Year 1

Working as a team, they all selected which material they were going to test, and all placed the item in coloured water on 'ready, steady, go!




We have been very busy in Science finishing our Rocks topic and looking at soil

Our Week of Learning

Year 4

This week, as part of our Roman topic, we have been investigating all about the life of a Roman Soldier.

In English we have been creating a job advert, looking at life in the fort, pay and pension, lifestyle, and fighting.

The Year 4 children have been using different features in their job adverts to persuade the

reader to sign up, such as special offers, bullet points, catchy titles and great descriptions of the benefits they would be offered.

On Thursday and Friday we made Roman shields to help us understand how they soldiers used their weapons and worked together as a team.



Once the shields were dry, we went out on to the playground to march in formation, the create the 'Testudo', the tortoise.



The children enjoyed trying to stay in formation and move together.

Year 5

On Wednesday this week, Year 5 had a science day to consolidate our learning on materials with some practical, hands-on activates to bring the subject alive.

Mrs Mallock planned and delivered a fabulous carousel of experiments including:

- HOW TO MAKE A LAVA LAMP to help us understand chemical reactions:
- FIREWORKS IN A JAR to help illustrate the different densities of liquids and
- DISSOLVING MATERIALS to help us get to grips with the difference between solutions and mixtures.





The children loved taking part in these experiments and enthusiastically recorded their findings using scientific vocabulary.

A huge thanks to Mrs Mallock for organising the day and for providing all the resources for the children to use in our experimental work.

Year 6

Our first half term culminated in a puppet show in science, which consisted of groups of four children designing and creating their own puppets then coming up with a short story to demonstrate how we can vary the size and shape of shadows from opaque and translucent objects. We definitely saw some 'unique and interesting' plots but each group was successfully able to explain how shadows can be altered and how variables such as the position of the object, place of the sun, time of day, etc play a significant role.

Year 6 also took some time out this week to design and make some Halloween cards for their buddies - some of which were given out in Friday's assembly and those Cygnets who were absent will receive theirs on the first day back - ironically on Halloween!

As a small reward for their hard work over the past half term, Year 6 chose to play a game of dodgeball in the hall and what a ferocious series of games we had. Special mention to Logan and Charlie for their sharp-shooting and Connie for being particularly elusive.
