COVID-19 Update

From the Local Authority meeting I attend earlier in the week, considerable time was spent reviewing the current rates in each locality and the increase in reported positive cases for children and staff in primary education. Data was also shared from the Office for National Statistics (up to 22nd January), which indicated that the reported positivity rate was highest in those aged 2 years to 11 years.

At the present time, with the positive cases that we have in school, please can I ask that face masks continue to be worn at drop off and collection time (unless medically exempt). We continue to monitor cases very closely and will keep you updated accordingly.

Safety outside school – School Entry and Exit Arrangements

With some concerns raised last week over children's safety on School Lane, due to stationary and moving traffic, from Monday 31st January all children from our School and also Cropredy Pre-School will need to enter the school site through the main school entrance on Station Road.

As the top gate from site will be kept closed at these times, all school users will need to exit the site around the school hall or through the main entrance. This will help children and adults to leave school gates and move straight onto pavement areas, avoiding movement through and around vehicles.

I will monitor how these altered arrangements work to support safe entry and exit from site; please do share feedback with me, so I can put in place the best possible arrangements, with the highest regard to safety of all.

From our discussions, please can I remind parents to take great care when parking on the road up to Great Bourton. Please can parents get children to leave the car onto the verge (not into the live traffic lane).

Please can I also ask that parents do not stop on the hatchings outside school to drop children off or collect them.

Big Garden Birdwatch

Pick a time over Friday 28 to Sunday 30 January, and watch the birds in your garden, from your balcony, or in your local greenspace for one hour. It doesn't matter what time you do your Big Garden Birdwatch, but you're likely to see more birds if you do it first thing in the morning.



Count the highest number of each type of bird you see all at once during the hour, not the total number you see of those birds. For example, if you see two blackbirds and then one blackbird 15 minutes later, your count is two blackbirds. Log your results at www.rspb.org.uk/birdwatch.
