### Friday After School Club Provision

As previously shared through the school newsletter, it has been necessary to review the after-school club provision that is currently in place on a Friday. This was important to do, to ensure that from a financial perspective, this provision was viable to continue at this time.

In school, we have completed a review of current up-take for the after-school club and have balanced this against expenditure required to run the club efficiently.

From discussions with the Governing Body, the decision has been made that as from the start of the Easter Term (5<sup>th</sup> January 2022), the provision for after school care on a Friday will not continue. The club will run, as usual, from Monday to Thursday 2.45p.m. - 5.30p.m.

I appreciate that this may cause some childcare difficulties for some parents, but hope this period of notice regarding the Friday club will give you adequate time to arrange alternative childcare arrangements as needed. Thank you for your support and understanding with this decision.

Next week is the last week of the teacher led after school clubs in school (including Dance Fusion Club). I hope that the children have enjoyed taking part in these clubs through the term.

Our Easter Term club programme will now start to be put together and circulated to parents early in the new year.

### **Workshop Content**

The fun, interactive and age-appropriate workshops help children to understand the importance of physical and emotional health; they learn vital life-skills that are also known to help their overall achievement.

- Early Years and Key Stage 1: children learn about keeping their bodies healthy, managing feelings, and being a good friend.
- Key Stage 2: children explore emotional needs, choices that can affect health and wellbeing, qualities of friendship and also learn strategies for looking after their emotional needs.

#### **Option 2**
