Staffing Update

We are currently completing our teacher recruitment procedures for Mrs Pounds and also for Mrs Middleton-Mai who are leaving us at the end of this term.

Mrs Pounds will be leaving to take maternity leave, in advance of her new arrival in the new year and Mrs Middleton-Mai has made the very difficult decision to leave our school to pursue other avenues moving forwards.

As soon as the recruitment process for these teaching positions has been completed, I will inform all parents of staffing arrangements, as from January 2024. A key part of this is to support an effective and smooth handover for the children, helping the children to know their new teachers in advance of the new year. If parents wish to contribute towards a leaving gift for these members of staff, this can be done through ParentPay.

Eynsham Partnership Academy Trust

Along with myself, the Governors have been working very hard to complete all relevant transition documentation for our move from maintained status with Oxfordshire County Council, to join Eynsham Partnership Academy Trust. Full Governor discussions have taken place and unanimous agreement for this movement has been gained; the Department for Education are keen for this transition to take place in early December.

I have led the due diligence work with the Governors which has built strong and effective relationships with the team at Eynsham. This builds on the school improvement work that the staff team have completed over the past three years whilst I have been Head. EPA have spent considerable time, alongside me, to develop their understanding of all our strengths and explore options about future partnership development opportunities that are in place within the trust, to help develop our provision further.

The Eynsham Team are very keen to meet again with parents soon, and I will inform you of this date when it has been confirmed with Eynsham Partnership Academy Trust. Thank you for all your ongoing support.

Cygnets Class

This week in Cygnets, we finished learning all of our Phase 2 sounds! That means we can identify all the individual letter sounds and some diagraphs like ch, sh and th in words. We love being digraph detectives during our lessons. After Christmas we will start learning the Phase 3 sounds. At home you can help us by reading our home reading books with us and practising the sounds sent on Tapestry. This week we have been looking carefully at sentences and trying to write our own to include capital letters at the start, finger spaces and full stops.

In Forest School this week we were inspired by Andy Goldworthy's 'Land Art', where he uses objects found in nature to create beautiful art work. We first collected lots of different colour leaves and sorted them by colour. Next we worked with our muddy buddy to create some circular land art. All of the Cygnets showed so much creativity and collaboration.

In RE we discovered what 'Advent' means, and that it is a time where Christians are getting ready for Christmas. We made a class advent calendar for us to count down the days on.

We are continuing to get ready for Christmas at Cropredy – preparing reindeer food for CropFest, practicing our acting for our Nativity and next week we will be making decorations for our classroom, measuring elves and writing Christmas lists!





Year 1 This week we have started to look at Stickman as our class text. We made our own stickmen then wrote instructions of how to make them. We then looked at the illustrations in the book and used verbs, nouns and prepositions to describe them.

In maths we have been subtracting using number lines as well as adding and subtracting 1 or 2. The children have shown great improvements in confidence through their hard work; they have also shown great ability to use strategies to support them, helping them to develop more independence in their work and how to apply their learning to solve problems.

In our topic work, we looked out the human and physical features in Cropredy.

Year 2 have worked hard through the week, completing their retelling of the story of Traction Man.

The range of descriptive language was very pleasing to see; with children also showing excellent recall of events within the story. Out English work then continued with a focus on how questions are used in poetry. The children wrote a range of questions, inspired by the poetry piece, focussing on questions they would like to find out about the world.





On Friday morning, the children had a lovely time making our Christmas decorations for the Christmas fayre.

All the children took time to choose colours carefully, weave pipe cleaner tinsel and add some carefully chosen sparkle! This gave for a wonderful, creative morning for all!

Year 3

This week in year 3 we have had great fun learning or practising our sewing skills to create colourful baubles for the Christmas Fair. In English, we are moving on with our learning and will be writing our character description next week. We are attaching a picture of our dream display board, which we are very proud of.


Year 4

This week in Year 4, we had our live PSHE lessons with Scarf Coram. The focus of these sessions was on our own identities and valuing the differences between us.

Prior to our live session the children complete their own individual identity tree.

After the session they turned their ideas into paragraphs about themselves and published these onto leaves to go on a class identity tree.

In English, we have begun our descriptive writing journey based on The Wind in the Willows.




The children have created a timeline of key events from the section in the book they will be writing about, have identified different word classes and past tense verbs in model texts and have shown their ability to use these in their writing.



Year 5 This week has been very exciting in class 5 as the children's project homework has been coming in.

I have been blown away by how much effort and thought has gone into each and every one, and there has been a real buzz in the classroom as the children present and discuss the techniques used and what they have learned.





We even had three controlled volcanic eruptions on the field! I have been equally impressed by the children's explanation texts on tectonic plate movement which demonstrate their language skills and understanding on the subject.

The children have also shown great skill in their Design Technology work, creating prototypes for their moving story books. The children have learnt about different types of mechanism to use, to help present moving elements in their storyboard work. Well done to all of Year 5!

Year 6 Through the week, the children have worked very hard, demonstrating great attitudes to their learning and a keenness to share their thoughts and ideas with others around them. In our English work we have looked at analysing explanation texts, linked to trench warfare.

Our Maths focus has been on developing skills when working with factors and multiples and also applying all our knowledge to approach problem solving and reasoning tasks.

The children thoroughly enjoyed their Science work, creating circuits and changing variables, predicting the outcome and then testing to investigate and review their hypotheses. This was very successful.

I must commend the children on their drive and efforts to support their Cygnets Buddies. The children organised a lovely art and reading session with the children this week, helping to further build and develop their strong relationships together.


During the session it was lovely to see the kindness, care and support that the Year 6 children provided to the younger children. Very well done to you all!


