Solar Panel Installation in School

I am very excited to be able to inform you that we have been successful in our application to take part in an Oxfordshire County Council De-Carbonisation Programme.

The school will now be having solar panels installed in school the latter part of January/early February.

Works will commence from Monday 24th January, with a clearly defined safe working area and scaffolding on one side of the playground for the duration of the works. I anticipate that these works will be completed by the weekend of the 5th February.
