


#### **ECO Warrior Update**

Next week is Anti-Bullying Week in school, working from resources provided by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. This year it has the theme **'Make A Noise About Bullying'.** 

The week will be kicked off with **Odd Socks Day** on **Monday 13th November**, where we invite all adults and children to wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us all unique.



Through the week, children will be taking part in assemblies and lessons, designed to help increase their awareness and understanding.

Through our learning. The Anti-Bullying Alliance resources will help the children understand that:

- Too often, we are silent when we see bullying take place, silent about the hurt bullying causes, and silent when we hear bullying dismissed as 'just banter'. It doesn't have to be this way.
- Of course, we won't like everyone and we don't always agree, but we can choose respect and unity.

Through our work, we want the children to have discussions about what bullying means to us, how banter can turn into something more hurtful, and what we can do to stop bullying. This will help us all to make a difference and take a stand against bullying.

### Cygnets Class

It was lovely for all of the Cygnets parents to be able to have a look at their children's work during Parents Evening. I hope that you found them useful.

This week in Cygnets, we have started our new topic 'Real Life Superheroes'. We have been building in our Superhero City, and doing what superheroes do best – helping! We thought of all the different jobs that people do and wrote about what we would like to be when we grow up. From police officers, to doctors, Spiderman and princesses – the future is in good hands!



We learned about Diwali in RE this week, and using salt dough we made our ow n Diya lamps. Once they had been baked we painted them with beautiful colour paint and then put a candle in. Diya lamps are important part of this celebration as Diwali is known as a festival of light.

This week we also learned about Remembrance Day, and why it is important to remember the soldiers who have fought in the wars. We painted poppies, which you can see in our classroom windows.


Next week we will be celebrating World Nursery Rhyme Week and learning the sounds z, qu and ch in Phonics.





#### **Our Week of Learning**


Year 1 This week we have continued looking at our class text The Three Little Pigs. We story stepped the story and acted it out. We then used this to sequence the story using a story map.



In maths we have been looking at find a missing part to a whole by using addition and subtraction.

In topic we started our Geography topic looking at our local area. We discussed rural and urban and what the words mean. We then organised photos into which category they were.

In our Design Technology work, children are enjoying learning about creating moving story books. This week, the children started to design their background for a moving story of the nursery rhyme, Humpty Dumpty. The children's creative ideas for their backgrounds are just fantastic and we are looking forwards to designing our moving characters, using sliding mechanisms and levers, to make them move.





Year 2 In our English work this week, the children have been learning about 'Traction Man', our current text that we are focussing on. The children wrote lovely responses, showing that they could draw meaning from different pictures within the book. The children also discussed and explained different things that they want to find out about Traction Man and his adventures; these ideas will help steer our work in English moving forwards.

During the week, the children worked very hard in their Science work, planning out an experiment to test different materials, following their investigation work learning about the different properties of materials. The children impressed us with their knowledge of scientific vocabulary when discussing and describing materials. We are all excited about completing the investigation planning and then conducting the experiments in our Science lessons in over the next week.

In Design Technology Year 2 have been learning about structures and what makes them stable. I was amazed at the breadth of questions the children had about how bridges and towers are made. We enjoyed testing the stability of 3d shapes with play dough. We learnt that the pyramid is a stable shape and the sphere is very unstable! Well done Year 2!

#### **Our Week of Learning**

#### Year 3

This week in English we have at last found out the name of our book 'The Tin Forest'. We have been making predictions as to what the old man may be dreaming about and creating our dream bubbles for display.

In PE, we have been continuing our gymnastics and have been practicing our balances both on the crash mats and then on the various pieces of sports equipment.

In French, we have been learning the days of the week and months of the year using a song to help us.



In Science this week, we have been experimenting with magnets, making predictions and finding out which materials are magnetic.





#### Year 4

This week in Science we have started our animal classification topic. We began by discussing what living things do and learning the mnemonic device MRS GREN to help us remember; Movement, Respiration, Sensitivity, Growth, Reproduction, Excretion and Nutrition. The children were able to classify different animals, by their attributes, into Venn diagrams with 2 and 3 overlapping circles.

In English, the children began their non-chronological reports on the animals from The Wind in the Willows. They discussed the features of a model text on hedgehogs and were able to locate examples within this. The children used present perfect tense in their introductory paragraphs and could decide what topics would best suit fact boxes and bullet points.

For DT the children are making sewn Christmas decorations with fastenings. The children analysed the pros and cons of different fastenings, made a paper prototype, cut out their felt pieces, and started sewing the parts together with a running stitch.

#### Year 5

This term, our science topic is Earth and Space so we have been learning a mnemonic and song to help us remember the names and order of the planets (as well as some of their characteristics) in our solar system. We have also been learning about the important scientific figure Nicholas Copernicus and the important role he played by the introduction of his controversial heliocentric theory of the planets.

In English we have been deconstructing relative clauses and relative pronouns before moving on to punctuating parenthesis. In maths the children have smashed factors. The children have worked hard through this week; well done to you all!



#### **Our Week of Learning**

Year 6 Thank you for all the parents who came to parents' evening this past week, it was lovely to either meet some of you for the first time or rekindle a former connection where I've previously taught siblings.

In class this week, we have worked hard to complete our adventure narratives based on WW1, these are now fully edited and typed up ready to be read the next time you're in. To go alongside these, the children have created an avalanche of poppies (various shapes, sizes, styles, tones and techniques) which you can see in the accompanying picture. A special thank you to Mr Watt who has created our class remembrance display using the children's poppies.

In Maths, our resilience and work ethic has been truly tested in Maths where we have been learning division - despite some wide-eyed looks, frustration and even tears - the class have worked hard to improve their understanding of this tricky concept. Well done Year 6!

In Geography we have been exploring the Earth, in particular learning about longitude, latitude, the equator and the all the other aspects that help us identify the location of landmarks, countries and such.


